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



ounded in 1963, D.G. Vaishnav College began its journey of educational excel-lence, guided by His Holiness Shri athureshwarji Mahodhaya of Vadodara, spired by the tenets of Vaishnavism, par-cularly the values expressed in the song Vaishnav Janatho" by saint Narsinh Mehta, nd was established by the Vallabhacharya idya Sabha. Generous donations from Seth uma Doss Dwaraka Doss and his brother, Seth michan Doss Dwaraka Doss, provided nearly 20 cres on Poonamallee High Road for the college. he college commenced on June 19, 1964, with ffiliation from Madras University, becoming a First Grade" college from the outset-a tribute o its first Principal, Adyapakaratna hri T. Totadri Iyengar. By 1966, firastructure expansion includ-d the Eastern Wing and the eth Purushotam Doss Gocool oss Hostel, with a growing taff and new facilities like a ennis court. The first Founder's ay was celebrated on March 8, 1966. n 1967, the college marked an international ilestone with a visit from students of the

udents of th sing the library and administrative sections constructed. That year also saw the launch e campus journal "Gokul News." In 1969, new ses like B.Sc. Chemistry and B.Com were oduced, along with Botany as an ancillary ect. The library was significantly expanded with nearly 2000 volumes, and facilities were extended to train first-year MBBS students. The 1970s saw further growth with the addition of gymnastics equipment, staff promotions, and the installation of a statue of Goddess

ounded in 1963 under the visionary guidance of H.H. 108 Gowsamy Mathureshwarji Maharaj, Shri Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha has been a stalwart in providing value-based education and community service in Chennai. Initiated by Shri Babulal M. Mehta and esteemed community members, the Sabha was officially registered on October 25, 1963, marking its commitment to holistic education. In 1972, Shri Kola Perumal Chetty contributed Rs. 1.5 lakhs and land for a CBSE-affiliated model Senior Secondary School, expanding further in 1976 with Kola Saraswathi Amma Vaishnav Secondary School for Girls. During its silver iubilee in 1992, the Sabha, in collaboration with Dewan Bahadur M.O. Parthasarathy lyengar Charities, established M.O.P. College for Women, supported by a donation of prime land worth Rs. 100 crores. This college offers courses in Commerce Business Administration and Mathematics Beyond education, the Sabha's Swami Vivekananda Diagnostic Centre,



established in 1998 within D.G. Vaishnav College, serves over 15,000 individuals monthly, providing affordable diagnostic services. Interview with Alumni Major General, Mr. Rajiv Menon, Department of BA CS Batch 1987-1990

FROM COLLEGE REBEL TO MAJOR GENERAL: REFLECTIONS ON LEADERSHIP AND MEMORABLE DAYS

ow were your college days?

Most of the time, I was out of college, but we had fun when I was there. Whenever I attended, I often got into trouble, usually for minor things like being late or skipping classes. The best part of those days was undoubtedly our excellent professors, who were always supportive and inspiring. I particularly looked up to Prof. Srinivasan, an amazing person who motivated us to do our best and stood by us even when we had attendance issues. He had a way of making every subject interesting and was always available to help students outside the classoom.

What was your favorite spot in the college?

I used to spend time with my NCC mates in the canteen, parade ground, and NCC store. The area behind the library, which looked like a forest, was also a favorite spot. We often hung out there, enjoying the tranquility and sharing stories. It was a place where we could unwind and connect with nature, away from the hustle and bustle of college life.

What was the funniest moment during class hours?

I used to come to class very late due to parade and cross-country practice. Within 10 minutes of arriving, I would often fall asleep. During college, my hobby was catching snakes and sometimes bringing them to class. I wasn't an ideal student; I was more of a rebel. I wasn't a topper, usually scoring around 60%. Captain Srinivasan, our ANO in the Physics Department, was an amazing person and a god-like figure for us. He used to call us the laziest persons. Prof. T.S. Padmanaban, who replaced Srinivasan sir as ANO, and our principal, Prof. Veeraragavan, along with Prof. Nagarajan, were also significant figures.

What do you think about the news and media today?

Journalism plays a crucial role in providing news to people. Unfortunately, journalism has taken a 360° turn today. Everything is available at a click, which changes the way news is consumed. The immediacy of news has led to a rise in sensationalism, often prioritizing speed over accuracy. It's important for consumers to critically evaluate the information they receive and seek out reliable sources.

What advice would you give to the younger generation?

Young people should sit and analyze things. They need to look at all sides of an issue before coming to a conclusion and finding the truth. Don't trust things blindly. Be critical thinkers and verify the information you receive. It's essential to develop a strong moral compass and stay grounded in your values. Embrace challenges as opportunities for growth and learning.




