From September 1st to 6th, 2024, 48 students from Dwaraka Doss Goverdhan Doss Vaishnav College (DDGDVC) embarked on an enriching academic exposure program in Malaysia. The initiative, aimed at broadening students' academic horizons, was organized by the Office of International Relations and included a certificate course in International Logistics, blending theoretical knowledge with practical application. The program featured both online sessions and on-site learning at UiTM College, Malaysia.

The exposure program offered a rich cultural and academic experience, starting with a tour of Malaysia's iconic landmarks, including Thean Hou Temple, Tugu Negara, and the Petronas Twin Towers. These visits provided students with deep insights into Malaysia's historical, cultural, and architectural heritage.

The academic portion of the trip was equally engaging. On Day 4, DDGDVC students participated in a paper presenta-

tion session at UiTM, where they shared research findings and contributed to intellectual discussions. A panel discussion on Artificial Intelligence, featuring distinguished experts, highlighted the growing influence of AI across industries. Additionally, students engaged in a course on containers and supply chain management, further enhancing their knowledge of international logistics.

The program also included industrial visits, such as a tour of Royal Selangor, a prestigious pewter manufacturer, and a visit to the Ministry of Youth and Sports in Putrajaya. These visits provided first-hand exposure to Malaysia's industrial and governmental sectors, complementing the academic learning. The exposure program, under the leadership of Principal, Capt. Dr. S. Santhosh Baboo and Organizing Secretaries Dr. A. Vijayalakshmi and Dr. K. Rao Prashanth Jyoty, proved to be an invaluable experience for students, enriching their academic journey and fostering international learning and cultural exchange.

HISTORIC WINS FOR DDGDVC AT UNIVERSITY MEET

The 56th Dr. Sir A. Lakshmanaswamy Mudaliar Golden Jubilee Commemoration Athletic Meet proved to be a historic event for DDGDVC as our students delivered an outstanding performance.

Held from November 26 to 28, 2024, at the prestigious Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, the meet was organized by the Department of Physical Education, University of Madras. It brought together an impressive 1,120 athletes (570 men and 550 women)

from 49 affiliated colleges and university departments with 22 events for men and women, respectively.

DDGDVC athletes left an indelible mark by clinching 12 gold, 10 silver, and 6 bronze medals, securing a prominent place on the leaderboard by record-breaking performances in the Javelin Throw, Half Marathon, and Relay Races.

Sasikala from Makhanlal Chaturvedi University, Bhopal, discussed AI's impact on multimedia and creative industries on day four.

The concluding session on day five by Mr. C. Sakthivel from Standard Chartered Bank, detailed on AI's use in banking operations. The seminar provided a comprehensive overview of AI's diverse applications and its pivotal role in transforming industries, while emphasizing the need for ethical considerations.

INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON "COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGIES IN CRIME PREVENTION"

The PG Department of English, Dwaraka Doss Goverdhan Doss Vaishnav College, conducted a "Library Orientation and Film Screening of a Documentary on American History and Literature" in collaboration with the American Center on 26th July, 2024. The event saw the participation of 50 including students and faculty at the American Center.

In the digital era, students prefer learning through audio-visual aids rather than reading through books. The excessive use of such audio-visual aids has affected

the reading skills of the students. To improve their reading skills, particularly for the purpose of research writing in the field of English and Literature, the Head of the Department, Mr. J. Praveen Prabhu initiated library visit programmes in the year 2022. Since then, every semester students are encouraged to visit libraries and utilize the resources available for research writing.

The Department organised one such visit in the month of July to the American Center, formerly known as the American Library,

part of the US Consulate General, Chennai. The Center offers an extensive array of resources and a wide range of interactive programs including English language workshops, entrepreneurial mentoring, film screenings, and story-telling sessions. Participants engaged in practical sessions that involved developing a blog application, gaining experience in handling models, views, URL routing, and front-end integration using Bootstrap for responsive

design. The session concluded with a Q&A segment, where the resource persons addressed various technical queries from the students. The workshop received positive feedback, with participants appreciating the hands-on approach, which gave them practical experience in web application development.

It also enhanced participants' understanding of full-stack development, improved their Django framework skills, and expanded their knowledge of front-end integration.

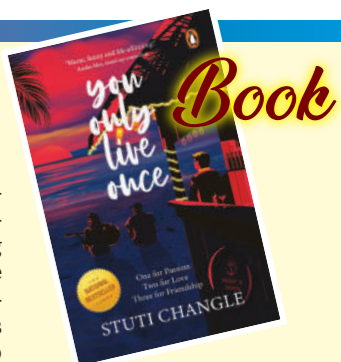

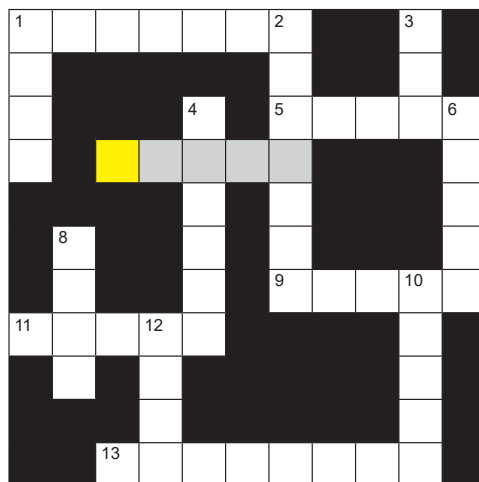

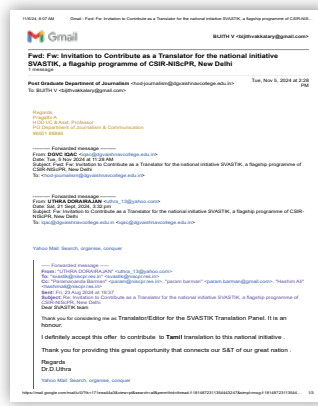

Stories in Focus: A Photographer's Experience with Cultural Festivals and Authenticity

In what ways has travel photography influenced your perspective on global cultures?

A journey is accompanied by encountering a diversity of individuals and diverse landscapes that grant their own unique perspectives. By hearing people's stories, seeing how they live, and being in places with different climates, I constantly hone my way of living, worldview, and overall approach to life. These travels were not merely journeys for the eye but have been steeped in life lessons that sculpted my perspectives toward global cultures into finer hues.

What drew you to document the Koovagam Festival, and how did you prepare for photographing such a culturally significant event?

I first came to know about the Koovagam Festival from news articles, but witnessing it for myself changed everything. There are huge numbers of transwomen and local villagers congregating each year to celebrate with rituals, songs, and dances. Grounded in epic tales, the festival has its own special meaning for every participant. I chronicle different moments—friendship, prayer, and ritual—without heavy preparation, letting my photography catch the festival's rawness and spirit in real time.

How has photographing the Koovagam Festival impacted your understanding of the transgender community and their cultural identity?

Though once naive about their lives, this momentum shifted

after attending the Koovagam Festival, where I learned profound lessons about their struggles for survival, mutual support, and their aspirations for better livelihood via education, employ-



ment, and service. I saw their festival celebrations, the bonding with villagers, and how deep-rooted their cultural relation with one another is.

What message do you hope that your photography conveys to audiences about the Koovagam Festival?

The Koovagam Festival offers two very distinct celebrations for observation: transwomen's worship and festivities at the temple and communal celebrations by the general public. Noticing each individual closely reveals the deep faith and commitment they are able to bring. Their strength lies not only in tradition, but also in their own journeys and yearnings that each of them, ultimately, brings to that culturally rich gathering.

What steps do you take to ensure that your travel photography represents the people and places you visit in an authentic, respectful manner?

Whenever I visit some place, I start with explaining to the locals my wish to take photographs. I show those images to the subject and share my background, which leads to that flow of understanding between me and the subject. This communication led to some trust development; thus, a lot of times, temporary acquaintances turned into meaningful friendships.

How do you deal with the challenges of photographing places that face problems such as over-tourism?

It is unfortunate that, at this time, tourism seems to be trending and fueled by social media. It is wise to keep in mind to shoot respectfully and without a foul on others. Be patient. It is important to wait for meaningful moments to get photographs. Our goal should always be to live consciously, document experiences without contributing to overtourism, or ruining a place.

What advice would you give to other photographers who want to document culturally sensitive festivals like Koovagam?

Take time to truly see the landscapes, the people, their stories unfolding before you whenever you embark on a journey to anyplace. Interact with them warmly, explaining what the goals are and listen deeply. Capture their moments with care, allowing connections to flourish. As you notice the little things, soft and slow, you'll find that your world begins to grow, an ever expanding one which hides many more layers than it showed you before.

Investing Smart: Stock Tips and Global Market Trends

1 How are current inflation rates impacting the stock market, and what sectors are most affected?

Inflation is impacting sectors like construction, hospitality, and the hotel industry. While inflation soars, consumer purchasing power diminishes, which leads to reduced spending. This affects businesses reliant on consumer demand. In addition to this, inflation increases production costs, squeezing margins and contributing to market volatility, ultimately diminishing investor confidence.

2 Which macroeconomic factors do you consider most important to watch right now (e.g., consumer confidence, GDP growth, unemployment)?

Inflation is the most critical macroeconomic factor to oversee, having an effect on consumer purchasing power, the cost of living, and economic stability. Apart from inflation, GDP growth and consumer confidence are key indicators. A deceleration in GDP or a decline in consumer confidence can signal financial instability.

3 Are there any specific industries or companies that seem particularly undervalued or overvalued at the moment?

When it comes to the banking sector, TMB Ltd is an undervalued private sector bank with strong fundamentals but lesser market recognition. On the other hand, P&G Health India in the household and personal products category looks overvalued, trading at a premium due to brand strength, limiting the upside in the short term.

4 How do global events influence the stock market, particularly for multinational corporations?

The global news that impacts multinational corporations involves changes in the U.S. Federal Reserve interest rates, geopolitical tension, and currency shifts. All these would have impacts on supply chains, costs, and investor sentiments. All positive events create market optimism that increases stock prices, whereas negative ones, such as geopolitical conflicts or rate increases, can induce instability and, therefore, decrease stock prices.

5 How can investors protect their portfolios against potential market downturns or corrections?

To prevent portfolios from getting weakened in case of a downturn, an investor should diversify the assets in equities, bonds, and real estate. Profits should be regularly booked and funds reallocated between debt and equity depending on market trends. Knowing what's going on and attuning your portfolios can lower risk and avoid loss in case of a correction.

6 How are current market conditions impacting the growth of Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) investing?

Current market conditions are in support of ESG investing, as environmental and social responsibility are considered priorities by the investors. The government has aligned rigid regulations with demand for transparency with in ESG practices. Trust is regaining, and more capital is flowing into businesses being directed toward ESG principles, hence fostering growth in this sector.

7 Are there any innovations or companies that could shape the future of the stock market?

Innovations such as algo trading and robotic indicators shape the future of the stock market with no emotional biases deciding their processes. The volume of the data processed by AI and machine learning does improve the trading strategy by being more efficient with higher accuracy in stock market predictions.

8 How important is it to understand financial statements when analysing a stock, and what are some good starting points for this?

Analyses of stocks heavily depend on the understanding of financial statements, as they exhibit company health, performance, and valuation. Important subjects to check are the rate of revenue growth, profit margins, cash flow, and debt levels. Investors will also need to look at ratios, such as the P/E ratio and ROE, in evaluating efficiency and market valuation.

MIND, BODY, AND GOALS: A HOLISTIC APPROACH TO A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

1 What habits can young people develop to ensure they stay consistent with both their fitness and life goals? Developing consistent habits is key for young people to achieve fitness and life goals. Start small, seek guidance from professionals, find an accountability partner, learn to say no to distractions, prioritise health, surround yourself with supportive peers, and avoid doing things just to be “cool” or succumb to peer pressure. Slow, sustainable changes in lifestyle are better than drastic, short-lived efforts. With discipline and the right approach, young people can build healthy lifelong habits.

2 What are some common orthopaedic issues that young people might face later in life due to neglecting their health now and how can they prevent them? Neglecting one’s health during their early stages of life can lead to orthopaedic issues like neck and back pain from poor posture and prolonged device use, tendinitis and carpal tunnel syndrome from repetitive motions like typing. To prevent these problems, one should engage in strength training and flexibility exercises, maintain good posture, prioritise a balanced diet rich in calcium and vitamin D, and schedule regular check-ups with healthcare providers to monitor bone health.

3 What role does physical activity play in enhancing concentration and academic performance? Regular physical activity enhances blood circulation and oxygen flow throughout the brain, which aids in improving the concentration and subsequent academic performances of the students. It elevates the secretion of dopamine and serotonin that triggers better mood and concentration. It also encourages neurogenesis that is necessary for memory retention, and reduces stress as well as anxiety, to help the students have better sleep. These benefits equip the students for achieving academic success.

4 What mind-set should young people adopt to stay motivated toward their long-term goals, especially when faced with setbacks? Youngsters must possess a resilient mindset toward achieving long-term goals. Growth mindset should be developed, and they should embrace that “every setback is a stepping stone.” Instead of setting back in terms of failures, they must be calculated as precious learning steps and stepping stones toward success. Attainment of smaller, achievable milestones helps in keeping up the motivation levels while working toward long-term goals. It also teaches them wisdom in learning from their own mistakes and other people’s mistakes.

NAVIGATING ACADEMIC STRESS AND SOCIAL PRESSURES: A MENTAL HEALTH GUIDE

1 What techniques can help a student to stay calm during high-pressure exams? Students should incorporate a proper time management plan and ensure thorough preparation to remain calm during exams. Regular breaks, rewarding themselves for accomplishments, and practicing relaxation techniques like progressive muscle relaxation can reduce stress. Techniques such as box breathing, positive affirmations, and visualizing success help enhance calmness, boosting focus and confidence during exams.

2 How can a student maintain emotional resilience in a competitive academic environment? In a competitive academic environment, students must focus on personal growth instead of comparing themselves to others. To maintain self-esteem one must avoid both upward and downward comparisons. It is vital to recognize failure as part of the learning process and seeking support from friends, counselors, or mentors can strengthen resilience. Prioritizing mental health ensures emotional well-being. Students should utilize resources like college counselors and be equally careful about blindly accepting anything recommended on social media.

3 How can a student deal with social pressures, bullying, or feeling out of place in an educational setting? Students can overcome social pressures by practicing assertiveness and setting clear boundaries. Developing social skills, finding like-minded peers, and staying true to their values helps navigate peer pressure. Recognizing and addressing bullying is important for creating a safe environment.

4 How can social media alter the way a person perceives their self-worth or self-image? Social media can distort self-image by fostering a culture of comparison, often based on unrealistic portrayals. Users may compare their everyday lives to curated posts, leading to feelings of inadequacy. Embracing self-acceptance and adopting a “Reel vs. Real” keep track of reality in the digital space can mitigate negative effects.

5 What are the best ways to manage screen time without negatively impacting mental health? Keeping track of time spent on social media can help raise awareness of usage patterns which can help students to be mindful. Turning off notifications reduces distractions, while limiting phone use for studying improves focus. Engaging in hobbies, exercise, or other activities promotes a balanced lifestyle, benefiting mental health in the long term.
