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

EVOLUTION OF VOTING SYSTEM IN INDIA

INSOLVENCY & BANKRUPTCY CODE AN OUTLOOK, PROCESS & SUCCESS STORIES

On 23rd August 2023, this session was led by CA Sandeep Kothari Partner,SSP Jain & Associates. The session provided a comprehensive understanding of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC) 2016, distinguishing it from conventional acts and codes. Participants grasped the nuances between insolvency, liquidation, and bankruptcy, recognizing the IBC's pivotal role in resolving financial distress.Key insights included the IBC's legislative scope, replacing outdated laws and amending over eleven statutes to streamline insolvency procedures. Emphasis was placed on creditor protection, time-bound resolutions, and the shift towards "Creditor in Control" for effective debt recovery. The session elucidated the IBC's structure, highlighting regulators like the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India and adjudicating authorities like the National Company Law Tribunal. Participants gained insight into the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP), understanding its stages and participant roles.Success stories, such as that of Bhushan Steel Limited, illustrated the transformative impact of the IBC, showcasing how efficient resolution strategies revived financially distressed entities and fostered economic stability.In summary, participants left with a nuanced understanding of the IBC's principles, processes, and outcomes, equipped to navigate insolvency issues effectively and contribute to India's economic resilience.

ENVIRONMENTAL FIELD VISIT

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Proposition 11

On 26th Aug 2023 the educational expedition took us to the historical Gingee Fort, also known as Senji Fort, in the Villupuram District of Tamil Nadu, India. The fort is a testament to India's rich history and architectural prowess, located about 160 kilometers from Chennai. The group explored the fort's archaeological sites, including the Kalyana Mahal, a sevenstoried marriage hall. The next leg of the expedition led us to a vast farmland, where we learned about groundnut cultivation, manual weed removal techniques, and sugarcane cultivation. The farmland visit underscored the importance of sustainable agricultural practices, such as the efficient use of motor hydro pumps for irrigation and the significance of organic farming.In conclusion, the educational expedition to Gingee Fort and the farmland visit highlighted the importance of sustainable agriculture practices and the need for conservation efforts.

FIRE THE FEAR OF FACING INTERVIEW

This session was organized by Samvruth on 10th and 11th of October 2023, this session provided a comprehensive understanding on the recruitment process, involves various screening processes, including Aptitude tests, Group Discussions, Personal Interviews, and Group Interviews. The Aptitude test is the first round of screening, involving multiple-choice questions that test a candidate's critical thinking ability and general knowledge. Group Discussions typically involve a case study and a specific time frame for discussion, evaluating the candidate's logical thinking and adaptability. Personal Interviews may be one-to-one or panel interviews, where the candidate's stability and attitude are observed. Technical Interviews are one-to-one, testing the candidate's basic technical knowledge for the specified job profile.

Day 2 of the Skill Training Program focused on the Aptitude Test, with Resource Person(s)

Mr. V. Dhamodharan and Mr. Parag Kapadia explaining the process to participants. Aptitude tests are challenging and can be easier if the candidate knows the tricks. Coding is another important aspect of the screening process, with types such as letter coding, number coding, and substitution coding. Algebra basics, such as ratios and proportions, are also taught to help candidates understand unknown variables. Probability is a branch of mathematics that calculates the likelihood of a specific event occurring, while measurement studies the measurement of geometric figures and their parameters. Overall, the screening process helps candidates prepare for the job and prepares them for the job.

INTRICACIES OF PGBP

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This session was organized by Samvruth on 13th of October, this session provides a basics of Profit and Gains from Business and Profession. PGBP is one of the five heads of income under Income Tax law. Under PGBP, profits and gains generated from the conduct of business and profession are taxable. However, all costs are not eligible for deduction from revenue, only business expenses. As profits are solely taxable under this head of income, there is a need for audit of the taxable profit computation of the business when business turnover exceeds the specified limit. Section 44AB of the Income Tax Act, 1961 outlines the requirements for auditing of accounts of certain persons carrying on business and profession. The assessee must have their books of accounts audited if they have aggregate receipts and payments in cash greater than 5% of total receipts and payments, total sales, turnover, or gross receipts in business greater than I Crore, or if they have aggregate receipts and payments in cash less than or equal to 5% of total receipts and payments and total sales, turnover, or gross receipts in business greater than 10 Crore. Eligible assessees who have opted for presumptive income schemes (i.e., lower than 6% or 8% of total turnover) must have their books of accounts audited by a Chartered Accountant to declare lower profits. Assessees engaged in professions with gross receipts greater than 50 Lakhs must maintain their books of accounts and must declare lower profits as income.


